

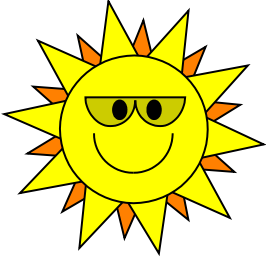

Using powerful words: Ray Bradbury likes to use words in fresh and different ways.

For example, to show how time steadily adds up, Bradbury refers to the word days as being compounded, even though the more traditional use of compounded is with the word money.
